Newark Thrift Store & the Homeless

The Newark area St. Vincent de Paul Thrift Store Board of Directors voted to allocate some of the money from the store's proceeds to their six member conferences to help with emergency and transitional housing for women and children. These conferences are St. Francis de Sales and Church of the Blessed Sacrament in Newark Ohio, St. Edward the Confessor in Granville Ohio, St. Leonard in Heath Ohio, Our lady of Mt. Carmel in Buckeye Lake and Church of the Ascension in Johnstown Ohio. This action supplements the conference's limited resources to respond to the increasing number of calls for help from homeless women who have no idea of what to do or where to go next. Funds may be used to provide temporary shelter in local hotels or boarding houses until a longer term solution can be found. Vincentians interview and support the women during this transition period, making sure that they are connected to the various local agencies, including their local food pantry

Store proceeds are also used to support the Newark Center's St. Vincent Haven, a men's homeless shelter, and the St. Vincent de Paul Food Pantry. Proceeds are also disbursed to the six member conferences to be used for clients of home visits.

President's Message

I am pleased to announce that the Board of Directors has elected me to another three year term as President of the Columbus Diocesan Council, beginning October 1st. I appreciate their support and will endeavor to continue providing guidance and counsel to all of your conferences as well as efficiently run our three diocesan ministries. Looking back on my first term we were able to obtain tax exempt status for all of our conferences as well as insurance to cover any conference liability issues that would come up. Our donors are now assured that their donations will be tax deductible.



We initiated our participation in the Friends of the Poor Walk and we able to raise over \$80,000 for our conferences and diocesan ministries over the last two years. Be sure to plan for the 3rd annual Walk on September 24th, this year at DeSales High School. Bishop Campbell has graciously agreed to be our honorary chairperson.

An Ozanam Orientation team was formed and they presented 11 sessions to over 225 Vincentians throughout the diocese. These Vincentians are now well grounded in the spirituality and operations of our Society.

We added two new conferences, reactivated one, and initiated a new youth conference at Bishop Watterson High School to go along with existing high school conferences at St. Francis de Sales High School and Ready High School.

Our Top Hat Celebration was changed to an annual dinner and Vincentian attendance significantly increased for that event as well as our Day of Reflection and Bishop Campbell's mass to recognize our volunteers.

A website has been added and we have initiated frequent communications with all of our conference presidents to keep them in the loop on all that is going on.

Finally, under the direction of Heather Swiger, our Diocesan Ministries Manager, the Clothing Distribution Center came to full fruition after having been started shortly before I began my first term. Likewise, St. Lawrence Haven and our Saturday Morning Food Program were continued and put on strong financial footing.

Looking ahead, I would like to encourage participation in Serving in Hope, a spiritual formation program that recognizes that all Vincentians must be rooted in the spirituality that is the heart and soul of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul. I am also looking at providing more training and direction to our conference spiritual directors and I will discuss the possibility of holding a strategic planning session with our Board to set our future direction.

But finally and most important, thanks to all of you for your support for myself and our Board and for all that you do to provide love, care, help, and assistance to those in need in the Columbus Diocese.

Thank you for the opportunity to serve as your president these last three years; it has been an honor and my pleasure!!
